### Report of the 2016 National IFYE Conference

The 2016 National IFYE Conference held in Manhattan, Kansas August 10-14 was a big success. Many Kansas IFYEs contributed their time and efforts to inform and entertain 180 IFYEs and their guests. The opening night reception at the Flint Hills Discovery Center impressed everyone with the wonderful exhibits and the excellent introductory film. Thursday's keynote speaker Jim Hoy told stories about the Flint Hills and its inhabitants. The workshops on bread, genealogy, social media, Flint Hills grasslands, and safe food were well received by everyone. Thursday night's program of the auction and Topeka Civic Theater's Radio Players provided entertainment and raised more than \$4000. for the IFYE program. Friday consisted of four all day tours to the Flint Hills, Abilene, Manhattan and Wamego, and Topeka. The weather cooled off so the tours were enjoyable for all. Friday night's program was a group of Filipino dancers from Junction City and Rick Dykstra, who showed beautiful photographs of the Flint Hills with commentary. Saturday morning was the annual business meeting conducted by President Victoria Warren of Missouri. The annual banquet on Saturday evening was delicious and everyone was impressed by a live presentation by the Peterson Farm Brothers from Assaria. The program concluded on Sunday with an ecumenical and remembrance service. The finances were kept below planned costs in most cases and almost \$8000. was returned to the Kansas IFYE Association to be used for scholarships and other needs. A great thank you goes to everyone who pitched in and did their part to make the conference a great success.
