## 4-H International Exchange Programs

### National 4-H Leadership Trust Confirms Direction 4-H International Program Committee (IPC) To Coordinate Group Programs IFYE Representative and Other Programs Continue on State Level

The National 4-H Leadership Trust, at their meeting earlier this year, confirmed the program direction they endorsed in early 2004...that the umbrella reference to 4-H citizenship and international programs will be "4-H World Citizenship" and that national coordination will relate to education and exchange programs for 4-H age young people, volunteer 4-H leaders, and Extension staff, and that emphasis should be on 4-H youth connections, staff and volunteer training, and on assistance to countries with 4-H type programs.

The 4-H International Program Committee (IPC), long involved with the 4-H/Japan exchanges and more recently with the FLEX (Future Leaders Exchange) program, will assume national coordination of the

outbound IFYE Ambassador group programs for young people 15 to 19 years of age. Groups will travel to Australia, Finland and Mexico in 2006.

IPC programs are coordinated through the World Wise organization in Seattle, Washington.

Other 4-H International exchange programs will be at the discretion of and coordinated by states direct with countries, as has been the procedure in recent years. Melvin Thompson, former director of 4-H International programs at National 4-H Council, will continue to assist and coordinate with states and countries as requested.

As always over the years, states determine what programs they will participate in and which programs they will administer themselves. ☆

### Idaho Legislator Tom Trail Promotes International Education and Exchanges

Tom Trail, ID-Nepal 1956, is a member of the Idaho legislature. He was the subject of an article prepared recently by Hanna Lee Betz, Idaho's director and the National chair of the American Field Service (AFS) Intercultural Program.

Trail introduced legislation in the Idaho House that encourages the state to review the educational opportunities available through student and teacher international exchange programs and the partnering of schools in Idaho with schools in other countries for the purpose of advancing cultural awareness and promoting mutual understanding and respect.

Betz wrote, "Across the nation, schools and communities are taking the lead through a variety of approaches." She goes on to point out that "students will need more than proficiency in reading, writing, math and science to have the knowledge and skills to be effective workers, citizens and leaders in the world of the 21st century."

In his resolution, Trail acknowledged that "developing and providing curriculum materials, fostering educational exchange programs, presenting other cultures, languages, economies and systems of government in an educational setting will support an international perspective to world problems."

In 1958, President Eisenhower voiced the importance of international exchange, noting, "Information and education are powerful forces in support of peace. Just as war begins in the minds of men, so does peace."

Former U.S. Secretary of Education Richard Riley stated, "Education exchanges are not a luxury - reserved for the few or pushed aside when other challenges preoccupy us. They are a matter of national interest."

Betz ended her article, "Let us hope that in 2005, others in the legislature will join Representative Trail to support international study and cultural awareness - recognizing the need to connect Idaho to the world."

May the same approach be true of legislators in all fifty states and the United States Congress! ☆

### Texas 4-H Members Raise \$12,000 for Tsunami Relief in Sri Lanka



Beginning in early January, Texas 4-H members raised \$12,000 for tsunami relief. The donation, through Mercy Ships, is being used to replace village fishing boats in Sri Lanka, one of the nations hardest hit.

4-H'ers from all across Texas raised the funds in a variety of ways. They passed the hat at 4-H meetings, held car washes, sold hand-made bracelets, conducted bake sales and solicited donations from local businesses. Both the 4-H logo and the Mercy Ships logo will be prominently displayed on each boat and every participating 4-H club will receive a photo of the boat their funds purchased.

"I'm thrilled we can contribute to an organization that's making such a difference in the lives of people all over the world," Texas Council President Bethany Richter said. After the presentation, Mercy Ships President and 4-H alumna Don Stephens commented, "These young people are a model for all of us."

Memorial Day and the commencement of most 4-H International exchanges at this time of the year cause us to reflect, reminisce and remember!

Most participants in the first years of 4-H International exchanges traveled by ship to and from their host countries...several on the R.M.S. Queen Elizabeth pictured above in 1953. What excitement that provided! Sad that costs prohibited such travel since the early years. Participants had orientation and language study daily and plenty of time to make the transition between home and a new culture.

There was the National IFYE Conference fifty years ago, August 4-7, 1955, on the campus of Michigan State University. Registration was \$1.50 for the conference, room and board \$3.50/day and the registration form read, "Please do not send money in advance." Were you there (photo right)? Do you remember?

In 1949, thoughts were still on recovery from World War II. National 4-H Congress delegates took up a collection for garden tools for Finland. Pictured below (l-r) with the dollar bills collected are Esko Rautio of Finland, Charles Sperow, WV-Sweden and Ruth Harris Eddington, WY-Ireland, all 1949 IFYE participants.

We also pause to remember those 4-H International exchange participants no longer with us - see In Memory 1948-2005 on page 4. We assume the list is not complete as we have so many alumni for whom we no longer have information or valid addresses. Please help us update the records.

Many of you will remember Faulton Hodge, NC-England/Wales 1953. He was an inspiration to the other 115 of us who traveled to all parts of the world that year. The National 4-H Council, thanks to President Don Floyd and his team at the National 4-H Center, created a national collection site for 4-H clubs and others to donate funds. More than \$5,000 was received and forwarded to Save the Children, the recipient organization, as determined by a nationwide vote of 4-H members.

## IBM and National Geographic Launch Genographic Project

IBM and the National Geographic Society have announced a five-year research partnership to deepen understanding of how the human race populated the planet, writes Valerie Halverson Pace with IBM Corporate Community Relations.

The Genographic Project seeks to chart new knowledge about the migratory history of the human species and answer age-old questions surrounding the genetic diversity of humanity.

The Genographic Project has two main components. One is the collection and field analysis of DNA samples - compiling one of the largest DNA collections ever assembled. In addition, the general public is invited to take

part by purchasing cheek swab kits and submitting their DNA for analysis. Individuals will then receive customized genetic maps with specific details of the migratory paths followed by their own ancestors.

Data will be analyzed and managed securely. The non-profit is led by distinguished population geneticist Dr. Spencer Wells.

## 4-H'er Makes Blankets for Russian Orphans

A 12-year-old 4-H'er, Natasha Swanson puts a little bit of herself and America into every blanket she makes for her friends in the Russian orphanage she and her sister left behind. As a 4-H project, she creates fleece blankets, one for each of the 30 young people still at the orphanage. Her new grandma showed her how.

"The children in Russia see a lot of snow. It's really cold there in winter, and it's cold even in summer. It doesn't ever get warm like it does here. I wanted to make the blankets for my country where I lived and that I love," Natasha said.

Two years ago, Matt and Kim Swanson adopted twelve-year-old Natasha and her eight-year-old sister, Ira, from the orphanage in a small village near Petrozavodsk. Natasha and Ira now live with their new brothers, 11-year-old Philip and 10-year-old Andrew, on the Swanson's small family farm near Ames, Iowa.

Natasha makes the blankets. Her sister and brothers, all 4-H members, then help her tie the square knots that hold the fabric together. Natasha paid for the blankets through donations from family friends, church members and others. "I want to make the blankets for the friends I left behind. I want to help them out. I want to keep them warm," Natasha said.

An American couple, adopting children from Natasha's orphanage, will deliver the blankets. ★

# J. Faulton Hodge

## 1928-2004

### The Woodwinds • The Churches of the Frescoes • Lifelong Friendships

Father Justin Faulton Hodge was ordained an Episcopal priest in 1970. His first assignment - New York's Cathedral of Saint John the Devine. Two years later he learned he was being assigned to the mountains in northwest North Carolina as rector of "all Episcopal souls." He was both thrilled and concerned. He'd only be a two hour drive from where he grew up in Rutherfordton to the south...but, he was being assigned to two small churches in Ashe County only one of which was operating - St. Mary's at Beaver Creek - with only thirteen members. The other was Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Glendale Springs, then in complete ruins.

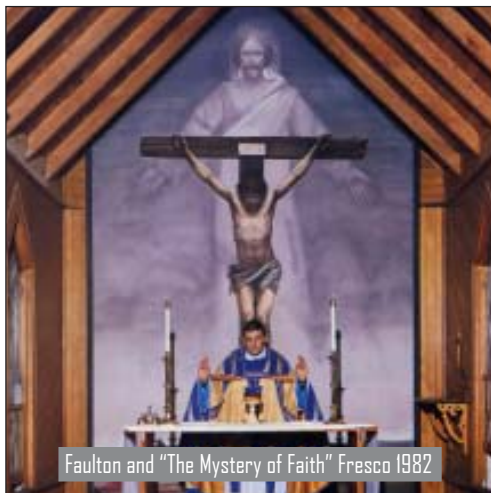
This was a young man, who several years earlier was at home on the family farm - known as The Woodwinds, active in 4-H, had gone off to college, and in 1953 traveled to England/Wales for six months as a 4-H International Farm Youth Exchange (IFYE) delegate. He attended graduate school at Yale University, worked for a time with the Dorchester garment industry, and then entered the General Seminary of the Episcopal Church in New York in 1967.

He was a hit with the country folk of the Carolina mountains. Church membership grew to nearly 150 members after one year and to over 300 by the early 1980's.

In 1973, Hodge met up with Ben Long, a young Carolina artist who had studied fresco painting in Florence, Italy. That relationship was the

beginning of what author James Dodson wrote "With some unorthodox methods and some uncommon frescoes, Father Faulton Hodge has pulled off a "small miracle."

Now often referred to as the Churches of the Frescoes, thousands come each year from around the country and the world to view "The Mystery of Faith," "Mary, Great with Child," "The Lord's Supper," and other frescoes that adorn the walls of these two revived country churches.



With all the fame, Hodge remained a country boy at heart. He loved the mountains and the people that occupied them. He was active in the community, rarely missed the annual conferences of the IFYE Association of the USA, of which he was an active life member. He had numerous friends at home and around the world. 4-H and the IFYE program were two of his greatest loves and provided many of his lifelong friendships.

In retirement, he returned to the family farm, where he welcomed guests, hosted receptions, performed weddings and baptisms, raised two chapels and a bell tower, and where he died April 22, 2004. A memorial service was held one year

later at The Woodwinds, April 2005.

# IFYE Foundation of the USA

## Foundation Supports Programs

The 4-H International Program Committee (IPC) has officially adopted the IFYE program for 2006. IPC has chosen Finland, Australia and Mexico as the first countries to participate with in an exchange of 15 to 19 year olds. David White, President of the IFYE Association, will provide more details.

The IFYE Foundation is supporting the orientation in 2005 hosted by the Illinois IFYE Association. Funds have been sent to provide the needs of the committee as they carry out this project.

As the time for orientation and departure nears, the Foundation is waiting for a detailed request for funds to support this year's exchange. Funds are available to support the travel for US delegates to their host country and for inbounds within the USA. Insurance and other necessary items are also items to be funded.

For the past three years, the IFYE Foundation has been a "pass-through" for State Department funds to support the Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX). Worldwide, the management organization for IPC had applied for their own 501(c)(3) status, so they could get the monies directly. However, the approval hasn't occurred, so the Foundation has again been asked to provide this service to

Worldwise. I access the funds, have them transferred to the Foundation account and the bank sends a check to Worldwise. This all occurs within three days and happens about three times each year. It's all the "paperwork" that takes time.

The future need for IFYE program support is going to be really important. As IPC and Worldwise establish the program for next year, they will be looking to the Foundation for financial support. Your contributions have been valuable to provide and keep the program operating as a state to country program during the past few years. Now we have a National program once again and with our support, it can hopefully grow into a unique and challenging opportunity for many people.
