

# Post-World IFYE Conference Italy Agriculture and Cultural Tour September 2-9, 2023

**Day 1 (Saturday, September 2) -** Today, leave Velden (early departure from Velden around 7:00 am) for Venice. Arrival in Venice bus terminal around 10:30 am and transfer by boat to San Marco Square (30 min. by boat) to the historical center. Free time for lunch and then take a 2-hour guided tour of Venice (outside visits only).

# **Overnight Verona**





**Day 2 (Sunday, September 3)** - Check out and travel to the Al Center of Italian Brown Swiss Genetic Center in Verona before enjoying lunch in the city. Next, take a walking tour of Verona that will include: Arena, Adige River, Castelvecchio fortress and bridge, Roman Gate, market square Piazza Erbe, Piazza de Signori, Santa Anastasia church, Juliet's house, Roman Bridge and Roman theater (outside visits only). **(B,L)**

**Day 3 (Monday, September 4)** - In the morning, visit a Parma ham producer. Parma ham is commonly referred to as prosciutto, a thinly sliced, uncooked dry cured ham. Next, take a visit to a Parmigiano cheese facility. This company focuses on the great tradition of high-quality cheese in Italy for over 100 years. This will be followed by a Balsamic producer in the afternoon near Modena. You will learn how one of the oldest products of this region is made. **(B,L)**

**Day 4 (Tuesday, September 5) -** Travel toward Florence, stopping by the brand new Eataly World: the world's largest agri-food park. FICO covers an area of eight (8) hectares (20 acres) in Bologna and encompasses: 40 farming factories, a market space, open-air fields and stables housing more than 200 animals and 2,000 cultivars. There are also six (6) large educational "rides" to explore. Guests here can learn about food processing by visiting the 40 farming factories and observing how meat, fish, cheese, pasta, oil, beer, sweets, etc. are created. Have lunch on your own and taste traditional Italian food at one of many restaurants! In the afternoon, travel to Florence.

**Day 5 (Wednesday, September 6)** - After breakfast, take a walking guided tour of the historical center of Florence (2 hours) and its most important monuments: St. Maria del Fiore Dome, Giotto's tower bell, Piazza de Signori, the facade of Palazzo Vecchio, Santa Croce Church, Ponte Vecchio, etc. (All visits are from the outside except for St. Maria del Fiore Dome which will be visited inside). Lunch on your own followed by free time. Pre-booked Accademia tickets can be purchased separately.

**Day 6 (Thursday, September 7)** - Following breakfast, morning farm visit with wheat, lentils, oats and other cereal crops. Guests will learn about how the soil, rainfall amounts and temperature of this region affects cereal crop production. Next, travel to a winery olive oil farm, lunch and tasting. The family farm has been producing wine and extra virgin olive oil in the Tuscany region for nearly 200 years. Afterwards, travel back to your hotel. **(B,L)**

**Day 7 (Friday, September 8)** - Take a high-speed train from Florence to Rome this morning. Private bus transfer to Rome's city center and visit to Trevi Fountain, Piazza di Spagna, etc. with a local guide. Also, enjoy a pizza lunch before arriving at your hotel mid-afternoon to check in. Free time the remainder of the day and evening.

**Day 8 (Saturday, September 9)** - Breakfast at the hotel in Rome. After breakfast, visit the Vatican Museum and take a guided tour of St. Peter's Square and Church. Lunch will follow at a local restaurant in the Vatican area. After the meeting, a small amount of time will be available to explore the city center monuments and the palaces of the Roman Forum, the Arch of Constantine, the Palatine Hill, Colosseum, etc. Pre-buy tickets to the Colosseum for those that are interested. Farewell dinner this evening!
