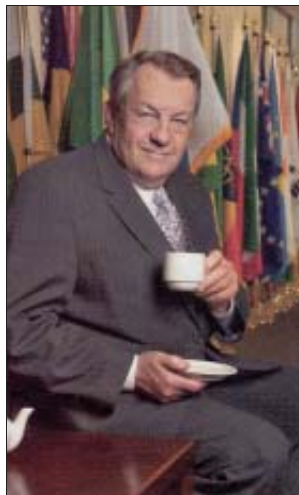
Peace Corps Prepares for 50th Anniversary in 2011

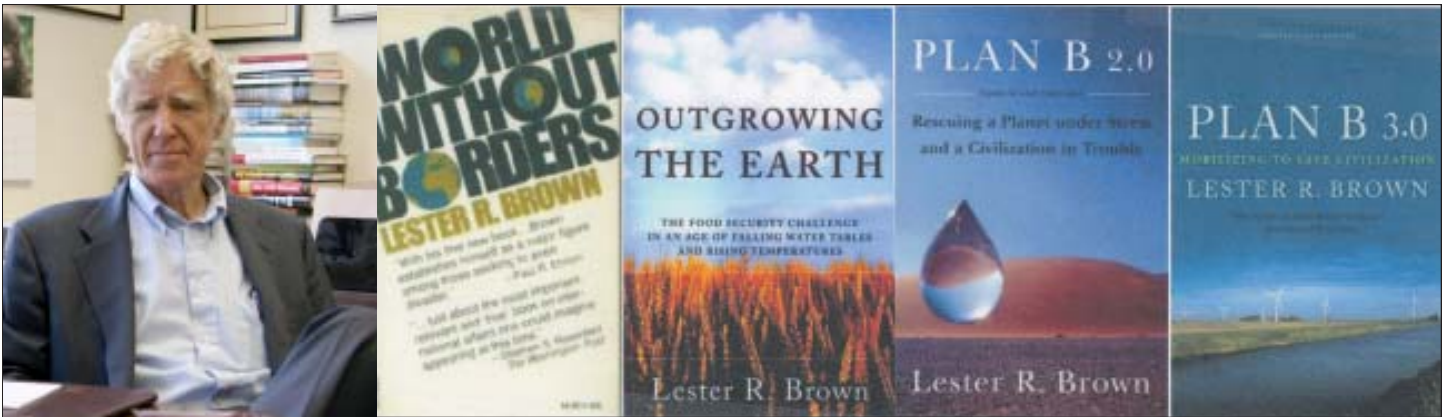
Kristine Beard and Lucille Linden Honored by IFYE Association of the USA

Kristine G. Beard (left) of Friendsville, TN, was awarded the IFYE Association's Friend of 4-H International award, and Lucille Linden (right) of Pullman, WA, the award for Meritorious Service to Extension 4-H International Programs, during the 2007 National IFYE Conference in Oregon.

Kris is a licensed architect and office manager for Beard Landscape Development. A 4-H member for 10 years, she has been active in 4-H programs for over 42 years in Oregon, Arizona, and Tennessee. She is married to Caron Beard, OR-New Zealand 1959. Their son, Kevin, was a Tennessee delegate to Jamaica in 1989. The Beard family has hosted many IFYEs and foreign students. Kris has served on several conference committees.

Lucy was an assistant to the state 4-H staff at Washington State University with responsibility for citizenship and exchange programs. She has presented workshops, conducted training programs, and developed orientation materials for the Labo program. She and her husband, Stan, have traveled widely. She volunteered in a London hospice and for Oxfam when living abroad. In 2001 she was one of the first 100 inductees into the Washington State 4-H Hall of Fame. ☆





**IFYE Alum Lester Brown - President, Earth Policy Institute
Runs Marathons, Promotes Biking, Heads Environmental Organizations,
Write Articles and Books, Earns Honorary Degrees,
and....has received World-Wide Recognition!**

Lester R. Brown, Founder and President, Earth Policy Institute, planned to raise tomatoes for the rest of his life when he left for India in 1956 as a New Jersey IFYE. He credits that 4-H International experience for changing his focus and shaping his future.

Remember *World Without Borders*? It was recommended reading for 4-H International delegates in the 1970s and 80s. It was Les Brown's fourth of over 50 books he has authored or co-authored since 1963. One of the worlds' most widely published authors, his books have appeared in over 40 languages.

Les graduated from Rutgers University in 1955 and earned an M.S. degree from the University of Maryland in 1959, and a Master of Public Administration from Harvard University in 1962. Following several years with USDA and its Foreign Agricultural Service, he helped establish the Overseas Development Council; then founded the Worldwatch Institute, the first institute devoted to the analysis of global environmental issues. In May 2001, he founded the Earth Policy Institute to provide a vision and road map for achieving an environmentally sustainable economy.

Brown has received some 25 honorary degrees, and numerous awards, including the MacArthur "Genius" Fellowship. More recently, he was awarded the Presidential Medal of Italy, the Borgstrom Prize by the Royal Swedish Academy, and appointed an honorary professor of the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

Heifer International - a global nonprofit working to end hunger and poverty and care for the Earth - recently recognized Les as one of the top "world changers!" That recognition resulted from a request for Heifer Heroes nominations - no one received more!

Cleo Kottwitz, Missouri IFYE to Brazil 1957, and volunteer with Heifer International, commends Brown's books, *Plan B 2.0: Rescuing a Planet Under Stress and a Civilization in Trouble* and *Plan B 3.0: Mobilizing to Save Civilization*, published in 2006 and 2008, respectively.

Their most recent venture was to Israel with Ohio farmers and agricultural professionals sponsored by the Negev Foundation and Ohio Farm Bureau. They visited Israeli farmers, communities, and officials. A highlight was to visit the Holy Land.

In appreciation for their IFYE experience, they provided an endowment in support of the Ohio IFYE program. ☆

Warren E. Schmidt

Advocate for Worldwide Youth Development and 4-H Education and Exchange 3 June 1917 - 20 November 2007

Warren E. Schmidt (left) was a real visionary when it came to 4-H International development, education, exchange and training. He was a key player when Dr. Edward W. Aiton coordinated the establishment of the International Farm Youth Exchange - now the International Four-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) - in 1948, the first of many 4-H International programs that have provided cross-cultural experiences for thousands of youth and adults and families in the U.S. and over 90 countries around the world.

An avid Wisconsin 4-H member, Warren liked to share that the opportunity to exhibit next to another 4-H'er at the Wisconsin State Fair named Marjorie was the beginning of a courtship that lasted over 65 years. They were married June 13, 1941. Marjorie died in December 2003.

Warren's early education was in a two-room school in Jefferson, Wisconsin, next to a small airport. He would sell soft drinks at the airport to make some money. He once sold a bottle to Charles Lindbergh and had an opportunity to sit in the "Spirit of St. Louis!"

He received his B.S. degree from the University of Wisconsin and an M.A. in Rural Sociology from Ohio State. A member of the track team at both universities he loved to tell of how he once competed with "the" Jesse Owens! No competition!

Following his years in the U.S. Navy during WWII, he served as Youth Program Specialist with the Extension Service at Ohio State and the University of Connecticut. He joined the staff of the Federal Extension Service in the late 40s and soon transferred to the National 4-H Foundation (now Council) as Director of 4-H International Programs. He was instrumental in the impressive expansion of the IFYE program and provided coordination and leadership for the first of several 4-H Peace Corps programs.

He was chairman of the 4-H committee of the People to People program, established by President Eisenhower, and served on the board of The Experiment in International Living, now one of the many programs of World Learning. Warren and Marge were life members of the IFYE Association of the USA.

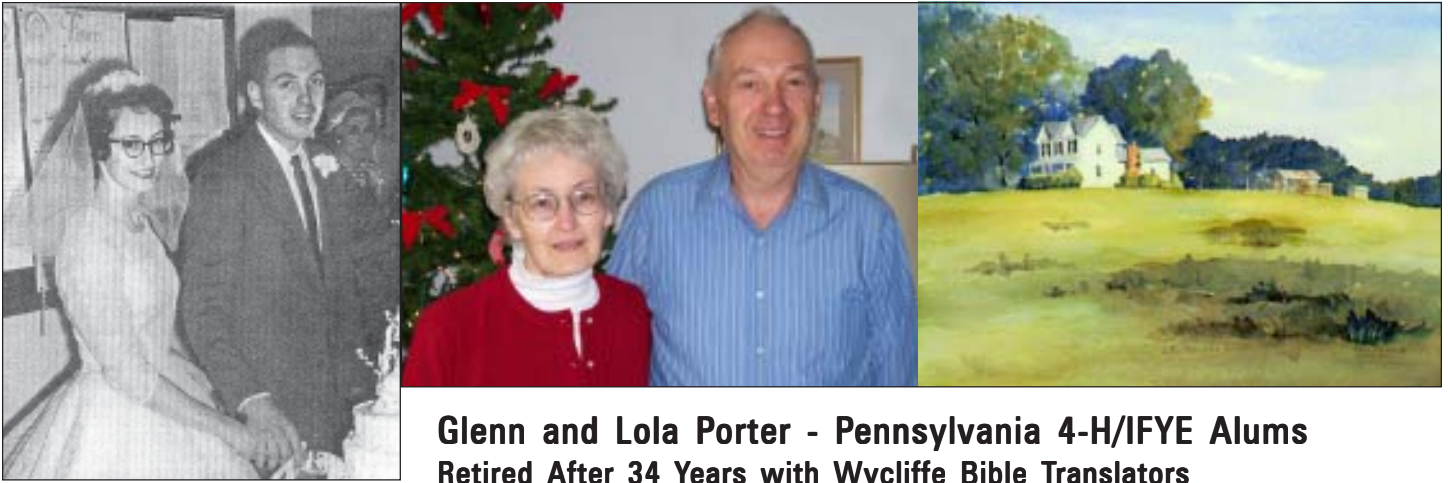
He joined the Rural Youth Division of the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) in Rome in 1965. They lived in Italy until their retirement to Naples, Florida, in 1978.

Grant A. Shrum, president emeritus of National 4-H Council (pictured left with Schmidt in 1965), wrote that Warren was "a capable, enthusiastic and effective advocate of the development of greater understanding between people everywhere."

W. Francis Pressly, who directed the 4-H Peace Corps project in Brazil and succeeded Schmidt as Director of 4-H International Programs at National 4-H Council, wrote "he was a man committed to rural youth development around the world and an inspiration to all of us dedicated to the cause." ☆

Glenn and Lola Porter - Pennsylvania 4-H/IFYE Alums Retired After 34 Years with Wycliffe Bible Translators

Glenn L. Porter was an IFYE to Nepal in 1961; Lola Rigel Porter to the United Kingdom in 1960. Their life together started with 4-H and IFYE.

They first met at the state IFYE orientation in 1961; then two months later at a Tri-State Extension Conference. Glenn entered the army in 1961 and they married in 1963. Glenn then had a year in Korea, after which Lola was able to join him for a year in Japan.

On returning home, Glenn farmed and Lola taught school. In a few years dissatisfaction set in. Were they called for mission work? They thought it required theology degrees. Then they learned about Wycliffe Bible Translators (WBT) and the variety of opportunities. Acceptance came and by 1975 they were in training in Costa Rica and on to Colombia, where they worked at the Translation and Community Development Centers.

After seven years, they were assigned to the British Wycliffe Center near London, England. Lola supervised the child care program and Glenn

worked on the Centre maintenance team.

In 1994, due to health problems they returned to the U.S. and were relocated to the JAARS Center in Waxhaw, NC - a partner organization to WBT, providing technical and logistical support for Bible translation work around the world.

In retirement, Glenn has established a business. GPorter Financial, a program through which they connect investors with individuals with notes - like trust deeds or mortgages - that they wish to sell. Visit www.gporterfinancial.com.

They have settled in Waxhaw. Lola assists with the business, is renewing her love for watercolor painting, and is doing some teaching.

Both occasionally volunteer at the JAARS Center. Always in mission!

Brothers? Not really! But...in a way they are! All because of a 4-H International exchange. Look alike? Sure do! John Wesen was an IFYE from Montana to India in 1951. In 1952, his family hosted IFYE Russell Gaston from New Zealand. Fifty-six years later they were reunited.

John and his wife, Dolores, had always dreamed of a trip around the world. That never worked out. Earlier this year they decided, instead, to visit Australia and cruise around New Zealand with hopes of seeing his IFYE "brother."

The Wesen's located Russell via alumni records and a contact in New Zealand. They had lost track of each other years ago.

The Gaston's met them when the cruise ship docked at Tauranga. "We had three wonderful days together," wrote Dolores, "Russell and John are definitely two self-made men."

"Russell bought bush country, cleared the land, and the farm grew to include 4000 ewes and cattle that he has given to his son. He has three children. John owns his home farm, bought two river bottoms and had thirty head of cattle. The herd has grown to four hundred head and he has both wheat and grazing land. He is now in partnership with his two sons," wrote Dolores.

John and Dolores have six children. His mother's homestead (below) will be one hundred years old in 2009.

Hester Bolitho, Russell's partner of 25 years, wrote "we have very much enjoyed John and Dolores' visit... repayment of the hospitality of all those years ago!" ☆

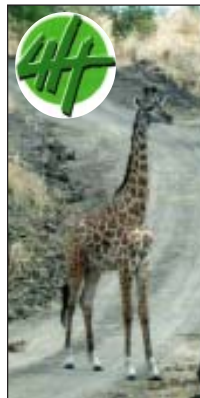
