Work on the Farm Bill has resumed in earnest in both the Congress and the Senate and the IFYE Farm Bill Subcommittee is still hoping to secure a place for international agriculture cultural immersion exchange programs within the framework of the next Farm Bill, along with 2025 appropriations for those programs.

outlining how the IFYE Association's plan is to use 2024 for the future structure of the organization and resume the exchange program in 2025. Follow-up calls were scheduled with the staff. The second letter was addressed to members of the House Ag Committee to explain how IFYE can help them achieve their priorities as outlined by the minority leadership of the committee.

Last week we learned that 2025 Appropriations requests are due soon. We submitted our first request to a House member last Friday and have requested forms from all members of the House Ag Committee. Eighteen members (at this writing) have replied with a form or link to complete in the next few days.

# **IFYE Strategic Planning Process**

Following the November decision to not participate in an exchange for 2024, the Board of Directors tasked the Development Committee to research how best to develop a new structure for the organization to move forward. The Development Committee commissioned a Focus Group comprised

of four IFYEs and four individuals from the private and public sectors. We included an expert in agricultural lending, an Extension Director from South Dakota, a current collegian who is part of Collegiate 4-H and has had international experience with States' 4-H International, an executive with a nonprofit association

management organization and the Agricultural Attache from Chile (a prospective host partner). The President and Associate Treasurer of IFYE were also on hand to provide organizational background and observe the discussions. Two professional volunteers, one of whom is an IFYE alumna, facilitated the day and a half meeting. The group was well informed of the history of IFYE as well as the current situation of our organization. The following are the outcomes of the Strategic Plan which was approved at the March 18 Board of Directors meeting.

Business Purpose: We (IFYE) offer immersive agricultural experiences across the globe to cultivate local leaders and benefit local communities.

This statement is used as we identify prospective investors (donors) who want to know what we deliver and what we provide to our communities. It is the "what" of our organization.

Organizational Purpose: IFYE offers global immersive opportunities for personal development and leadership growth within agriculture to empower local communities. This is a statement of what competencies, capabilities, and unique benefits we offer people. This purpose also shares the long-term effects of being involved in the IFYE organization.

**Values:** *Community, Collaboration, Leadership (ownership, commitment, advocacy)* These values are principles and attributes we hold dear to our hearts. They are our nonnegotiables – without them, we would not be who and what we are.

Vision: IFYE is the most trusted source of impactful learning experiences, fostering leadership development and creating enduring global partnerships in agriculture and food production. This is who and what we want to be. It is what we are working toward and it drives the work of our membership.

As with any organization, there must be objectives to guide the work of the organization. The following four statements are what the Board of Directors and our National Board committees will be working toward this year as we move the organization forward:

## **IFYE OBJECTIVES**

- 1. Generate enough support to fund strong and vibrant programs.
- 2. Develop a diverse portfolio of partners to support programs.
- 3. Become a household name among agricultural and food production stakeholders.
- 4. Create a world-renowned exchange that is safe, affordable, and integrated with partners both foreign and domestic.

As with any strategic plan now the work begins in earnest. Your BOD is finalizing the committee structure that will best support the plan.
