and communicated their experience through social media, on our website, and in the newsletters. We alumni shared what made for "life-changing experiences" in our newsletters and at the national conference. Our new IFYE updates shared progress in the program, funding, and Board of Director efforts.

In review, though, it appears as if perhaps not enough was shared to help all to learn what is happening, what can happen - with your help! I suggest this because in a variety of ways and in different settings, I have heard it said that perhaps the IFYE Program is not relevant in today's world. Thinking about the word relevant and two common meanings important or significant - I ask you, in response to the question "Is IFYE relevant today?" the following: Is family relevant? Is friendship relevant? Is cultural understanding relevant? Is learning relevant? Is peace relevant? Is personal growth relevant? Is sharing relevant? Is adapting to and thriving through challenges relevant? Is finding both similarities and differences and learning to appreciate each relevant? If IFYE even helps with one of these, doesn't that make it relevant? When I met the 2015 IFYEs at their return, they described the value of their experience in terms such as:

- "Actually getting to know the people"
- "Can't put a price on new friends and family"
- "Connected in many ways"
- We are "different but similar"
- Learned to be "adaptable, independent"
- "Pushed out of comfort zone in a good way"

Should one be asking, has the IFYE program lost its relevancy or is the IFYE exchange becoming obsolete? After all, today anyone can be in another country or continent in 24 hours

Dear Fellow Members of the IFYE Association,

As I think back on 2016. much was learned and much was shared. Our IFYE outbounds learned about life in cultures unlike their own and shared their experiences in newsletters, social media, and on-line. Our IFYE about inbounds learned our culture while sharing in family and community life in many states. Host families learned the joy of hosting (for the first time or again), the joy of adding a new member to their family

or less - air travel is that easy! And, unlike when many of us were IFYEs, lots of young adults have traveled with family, friends, church, and/or school. If that's the case, why IFYE? Why not just "fold up our tents" and put our money and our efforts elsewhere?

In response to that, please read about the value of cultural immersion and cultural competence from the *IFYE Case Statement*¹ (© December 2015 by Nancy Valentine Harper, Ed.D., Group Leader WV-UK 1978).

<u>Cultural Immersion</u> - According to Art Markman (2015), in "Why People with Multicultural Experience Are More Creative," he believes a person who has immersed themselves in another culture has the openness and cognitive flexibility to make organizations more creative. He goes on to say that "most creative people have two things in common: They are willing to consider alternatives to the way things are currently done, and they see objects, people, and situations from multiple perspectives." Being immersed in a culture, Markman believes, increases your overall openness to new experiences and you begin to realize that everything in the world can be viewed in many different ways.

Research by Adam Galinsky and his colleagues at Columbia Business School has shown that people who have spent time adapting to more than one culture are better able to generate new ideas both in laboratory studies and in corporate settings.

<u>Cultural Competence</u> - One of the long-term outcomes of the IFYE program is to build cultural competence in individuals, families, and organizations. Cultural competence has been defined in different ways. In the August 2015 edition of the Diversity Officer Magazine, one article says that "cultural competence refers to an ability to successfully negotiate cross-cultural differences in order to accomplish practical goals (Vaughn, 2007). The goal may be selfish, as in dating someone who speaks a different language, socially responsible, as in trying to create a more inclusive society, or collaborative, as in working as a member on a cross cultural team. Cultural competence has four major components: awareness, attitude, knowledge, and skills (Pedersen, 1997)."

And here are some ways in which the IFYE experience is different, again from the *IFYE Case Statement*¹.

Host families:

• Fully integrate IFYEs into the family unit where they become integral to all aspects of family life, such as

sharing household and family chores, enjoying family outings, and joining in community activities.

Develop lifelong family and community relationships

• Increase cultural competence.

IFYEs themselves typically have much different experiences than other exchange programs. For example, they:

- *Live with multiple families in different regions of their host countries, thus gaining a broader understanding of varying cultural, geographical, political, and climate differences.*
- Reside in one or more host countries for three to six months (with six months as the preferred model) which enables IFYEs to form a deep appreciation for their host countries and its peoples.
- Experience total cultural immersion without being distracted by expectations of educational institutions or other obligations.
- Are likely to approach their international experience from a "service learning" perspective and the desire to make a difference

The IFYE program itself has the following characteristics and attributes:

- an established international network of IFYE alumni
- an established international network of countries interested in...and actively engaged in...cultural exchange programs
- a nation-wide network of approximately 4,000 IFYE alumni who have the potential to work with companies and post-secondary institutions to recruit young people interested in internships abroad that could result in a career and/or employment with specific companies
- the ability to provide opportunities for domestic and international young people to inform local, state and U.S. government agencies, land-grant universities (many of whom have established programs with other countries), and organizations of needs and priorities in other countries.
- offers total cultural immersion for IFYE participants to be completely engaged in the family, community, and culture of the host country.

ASSISTANT for VICE PRESIDENT and TREASURER

The Assistant will work with the Vice President, Finance Committee, Treasurer, and IFYE Bookkeeper to evaluate accounting information on an ongoing basis and to provide Excel spreadsheets for use by the IFYE Board of Directors. The volunteer should be able to design and modify Excel spreadsheets with formulas and to work in QuickBooks. Tasks will include: evaluating the Bookkeeper's QuickBooks accounting - monthly entries of donations, expenses, and IFYE conference; and evaluating monthly and year-to-date actual expenses to the budget by department. With the VP and Treasurer, the volunteer will develop future estimated donations and expenses and prepare the Excel worksheets. The volunteer will also work with the Vice President, Treasurer, Bookkeeper, and Finance Committee to develop the annual budget for Board approval. Estimated monthly time required: 16 to 18 hours.

So, what is it that we may have failed to share with you about where we are trying the steer the ship of the IFYE Program? In August 2015, a group of young adults in Minneapolis, MN were invited to participate in a focus group to get feedback on continuing and expanding the IFYE Program. Participants favored a 3- to 6-month experience during a college/university semester, or the summer between semesters, or right after graduation. There was interest in college credit, international internship experiences related to career goals, service learning, and being able to develop and implement a project. While the current IFYE Program cannot provide an internship or college credit, Alan Lambert, our National Program Director, and the Program Development and Resource Development Committees are working to identify ways to help participants who wish to enhance their IFYE experience with any of these components. We are also contacting agricultural companies about combining international internships with host family experiences.

I leave you with some final thoughts from the *IFYE Case Statement* that show the continued relevance of IFYEs overarching goal of "Peace Through Understanding":

William Hunter (2004) states that "until September 11, 2001, most U.S. citizens considered themselves untouchable, distanced from the evils of war and terrorism {but}...this presumption of invulnerability was destroyed...as the planes slammed into the World Trade Center towers in New York." Bikson, Treverton, Moini, and Lindstrom (2003) believe that "the events of September 11 {2001} underscore the importance of developing a broader and deeper understanding of the differing perspectives of people from other countries and other cultures, and of learning to work effectively with people who differ in language, customs, and in some cases, political and social values."

2017 IFYE Program Report

The 2017 IFYE program continues to provide unique cultural opportunities for both inbound and outbound IFYEs. In addition to the traditional host family experiences and the invaluable personal growth that occurs, recent and current IFYEs are asking for opportunities to advance their professional development.

While this is not an easily remedied task, efforts are being made to incorporate activities which result in sharing of professional knowledge, learning from country experts, and service learning or community volunteerism. Pilot programs are beginning to take shape in participating countries where IFYE and 4-H are integrally linked (Costa Rica and countries in Asia & Scandinavia). Additionally, several US states are 'putting on their thinking cap' to find ways to similarly positively impact inbound IFYEs as well.

Outbound IFYEs

The 2017 IFYE program expects to send 10 individuals abroad for either a six or three month program. They will have the opportunity to choose from 13 participating countries in 2017. *(See map on <u>http://ifyeusa.org</u> homepage.)*

Those US IFYEs on the six-month program will be placed in two countries for approximately three months each, while those IFYEs on the three-month program will be placed in one host country. Each outbound IFYE pays a program fee toward the total program cost. Host countries are asking for more US IFYEs, so please visit with and encourage a young adult, age 19 and above, and help them apply immediately! The application is on the <u>http://ifyeusa.org</u> website under the EXCHANGE PROGRAMS tab. They may also contact me at my information at the top of the next column.

Inbound IFYEs

Most will be on a three-month program beginning in mid-June and ending in early September 2017. Final numbers are not known at the moment and there may be some last minute changes. Our goal is for each of the multiple host families to welcome an inbound IFYE into their home and lives for approximately three weeks during this three-month program.

45,000+ kilometers. 180 days. 2 countries. 14 host families. This shines only a sliver of light on the relationships and experiences that occurred in six months – and really, my exchange is just the beginning to a life-long IFYE adventure to come!

Estonia (Eesti)

Not only did I pick up a lot of the language, but have fallen in love with the people, potato salad, sunsets, folk sayings and everything in Estonia. It's possible I'm part Estonian, but I would also attribute that to my "baptism by sauna". Stepping outside my comfort zone to sit and sweat and skinny dip with my families was nerve-wracking to anticipate; yet, the traditional *Eesti* sauna was thoroughly satisfying after my first go.

In Estonia, I lived with seven families, taking on some of the day-to-day projects of gardening, rolling up electric fence, packaging sausages, serving in a café kitchen, prepping for the first day of school, teaching country western dances, and picking berries galore. With long summer days, we had time to play – exploring festivals, forests, lakes, castles, beaches and bogs.

I have treasured the opportunity to see Estonia through the eyes and hearts of the amazing families that live here, and I am looking forward to returning to my *kodu* (*home*) away from home.

The icing on the *Eesti* cake was getting to go to the European IFYE Conference held in Estonia this year! Less sleep = more fun. IFYE Conference = life-long friends in 17 countries = couches to crash on around the world.

During my free time between countries, I landed in Wüsting, Germany for bonus IFYE time with new friends.

India

Lesson #1 in India was learning how to embrace the ebb and flow of traffic, language, culture, food, life, and time relativity. Incredibly beautiful and diverse, life is an organized chaos of cultures, religions, languages, and people.

Caitlyn and I stayed with seven families throughout northern India. We spent time in New Delhi, Agra, Chandigarh, the terraced apple orchards in Himachal Pradesh (foothills of the Himalayas) and the agricultural breadbasket of Punjab. We went with our families to Hindu temples and Sikh *gurdwaras*. We helped juice apples, cook, milk cows, groom horses, update farm ledgers, and create a video for one family's farm stay. (Google "Himalayan Orchard" and check it out for your next trip to India.)

On November 8, India's Prime Minister Modi announced without warning that all 500 and 1000 rupee notes were no longer valid, slamming the brakes on the Indian rhythm of life during wedding season, wheat planting, and paddy harvest. People had to get creative to carry on. Hundreds of people in queues (lines) for banks and ATMs were (and still are) a common sight. Caitlyn and I queued for days to get needed cash. With a cap of withdrawing 2000 rupees/ day (\$30 USD), it took a while. It was an interesting time to be in India and see demonetization from many different perspectives and empathize with some of the challenges of this change.

Of course, traveling by car, bus, cab, train, *tempo (*a type of open van), Uber, and camel in Indian traffic was half the adventure. We crossed off some major bucket list destinations like the Taj Mahal, Golden Temple, Rock Garden, and the India-Pakistan border with our families and friends or on our own.

I was so challenged and humbled by this experience and am looking forward to trekking back.



Tour 1 – Bok Gardens and Pinewood Estate - (\$70)

Peace Through Understanding

Following up on a couple of tips from IFYE alum re John's and other alumni's part in the early days of IFYE, this editor visited John Geurtze (NY Germany 1951) earlier this spring.


John shared letters and other information that he had written "back home", as well as those of Les Nichols, who had just started work with the "IFYE Project" on the national level. In 1951, there were 58 IFYEs representing 33 states (and Alaska - *not a state until 1959*) traveling to 22 different hosting countries.

His first letter (July 4, 1951) "back home" told of the IFYEs' purpose which was developed on the ship voyage to Europe: "We International Farm Youth Exchange Delegates feel that agriculture is the backbone of any nation and that the rural youth are future leaders of the world. By living, working, playing and exchanging ideas with World farm families and organizations, we hope to develop peace and understanding throughout the world."

In John's last letter home (October 7, 1951) before leaving Germany, he wrote: "If there could be more programs of this type, I know we of the United States would increase the sense of brotherhood which means so much in this confused world. The world is getting smaller every day and all of you know

as well as I that peace is cheaper than war. So let's all help in every way we can to have better understanding in the home, nation, and world for that is the big step toward world peace. These people should no longer be called 'foreigners' but 'neighbors'. We are all alike but just speak a different language. However, actions speak louder than words."

Although these letters were written over 65 years ago, the heartfelt words hold true today as well. It is

11th World IFYE Conference (September 9-16, 2018) *Kim Reaman (Co-Chair)*

A highlight of 2018 could be "Cruisin' with IFYE" at the 11th World IFYE Conference! The conference will be aboard a 7-day Alaskan cruise which will depart from Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada on September 9th and arrive in Seward (Anchorage), Alaska on September 16th, 2018. The cruise will feature many of the traditional components of a World IFYE Conference, but you will be aboard the Holland America ms Noordam, sailing past a breath-taking coastline where you will have a chance to see all of Alaska's natural wonders – from calving glaciers to breaching humpback whales.

Registration for the conference and cruise booking: Registration will be available online in June 2017. The registration fee for the World IFYE Conference will be minimal because most of the expenses will be included in the cost of the cruise. There is a variety of staterooms and suites available on the ms Noordam so you will be able to find one which fits your budget. Most cabins will be comfortable for two people. Some cabins can accommodate three or four people comfortably. It will be important to register early to make sure you get your first choice. A cruise informational flyer highlighting the cabin types and basic cost will be available soon on the IFYE website. *Note: Check out the various possibilities available for your trip onward from Seward after the cruisin' 2018 World IFYE Conference.*

Meet and Greet Pre-Conference Activity: For those individuals who wish to participate in a Meet and Greet Pre-Conference activity (whether or not you are booked for conference or sailing on the Holland America ms Noordam), the event will be held on the evening of September 8 in Vancouver.
