
The group that partakes of the Afternoon Activities will choose a place for a group meal in the evening in either Jacksonville of Springfield.

IL IFYE Association is going to sponsor two inbound IFYEs: Anna Elisabet Luomajarvi (18) from Finland and Amanda Bayles (28) from Tasmania, Australia.

Anna speaks three languages English, Swedish, and some German. She grew up on a farm. Her family has 30 Herefords, sheep, a horse, cats and dogs. She left home at sixteen to attend secondary school. She graduates on June 4th. She has worked as a 4-H club leader for the past two years. Her family has hosted four IFYEs. She has had 4-H summer pigs. She is most interested in beef cattle, especially Hereford, but she likes all animals and country life. Her favorite topics of study are history, literature, and English. She likes example knitting, crocheting, baking, photography, riding and hiking.

Amanda is a dairy shed manager of 2200 cows on three farms that encompass approximately 3,000 acres. Her family farm is about 4,500 acres of mixed crop production, sheep, and cattle. International Opportunities

Would an international living experience be in your immediate or near future? (Please share with someone you know who might be interested)

IFYE is an international cultural exchange program designed for young adults, 19 years and older. IFYE emphasizes the understanding of other cultures by living it on a day to day basis, rather than seeing the culture from a tourist point of view. As an IFYE, you participate in daily activities with your host families. Without the encumbrances of an academic program, you will be more fully engaged in all aspects of your host family's lives.

IFYE's goal is to have you become a "son" or "daughter" with that host family.

For an example, former Illinois IFYE's to West Germany for six months (June - Dec.) lived with 7 different host families, each for a period of approximately three weeks. They may have begun their program with their first host family in northern Germany, near the border with Denmark, and ended in the Bavarian Alps with Brown Swiss cows and bells on their necks in December.

Currently, either six-month (beginning in mid-June and ending in early December, 2016) or three month (June - Sept. or Sept - Dec. 2016) programs are available. Participating countries in 2016 include: Austria, Costa Rica, Estonia, Finland, Germany, India, Norway, South Korea, Poland, Sweden, Switzerland, Taiwan, Thailand and the United Kingdom (Devon County in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales). For those on a six-month program, you have the opportunity to live in two separate countries, while those on a three-month program will have one host country. A six month participant will have approximately two weeks free time between countries, or if spending all 6 months in one country, then some flexibility will be possible.

Asia-Pacific IFYE Conference

The India IFYE Assn. hosted a wonderful Asia-Pacific IFYE Conference last November. They went all out to welcome the conference participants and show us their culture; and also to educate us on the agriculture, the challenges, and the opportunities India faces today as a country of 1.25 billion people.





I was impressed to learn of modern agricultural practices, such as laser leveling to conserve water on irrigated land and the use of genetically engineered crops, yet surprised to see the extent of manual labor still being used. The fields of wheat, canola, and vegetables which I saw looked excellent. During the discussions held at the hotel I heard very similar topics and concerns which I hear here in Illinois; the importance of plant nutrition, concern regarding nutrient run off, economy of scale, food hubs, micronutrients, and the importance of agricultural education. But while on our home farm we often rely on the younger generation to learn about and incorporate new technologies in our operation, in India the older generation is regarded as the teachers, so adoption of new methods is a challenge. As the country's population continues to grow, the demand for food and water, of course, will grow with it. They are aware of the challenges and are proactively looking for solutions. We were taken on a tour of an agricultural college where we learned of a research project harvesting monsoon rainwaters to recharge wells. We also visited research plots where various methods of irrigation were being evaluated. Worldwide all are recognizing the importance of water conservation.

Leadership at the conference appealed to the attending countries to send IFYEs to India. They are looking for exchangees who are willing to give their time, knowledge, and experience to learn about, understand, and help India as it rises to its challenges. They especially want to use IFYE as a vehicle to help improve agriculture. In return they said they would find a way to show the participant any of their specific areas of interest.

IFYE events also always include visits to area cultural sites. We spent many hours on buses traversing the countryside to visit places such as the revered Golden Temple and the foothills of the Himalayas. The rides themselves were as educational as the places visited. Riding on a bus for several hours a day on Indian roads in Indian traffic is something to experience! I had heard of the variety of vehicles and animals all sharing the same roadway, but to see it, and to hear the constant honking of horns was quite unbelievable. Each of our buses had two armed guards who would get off the bus and direct traffic or move barricades to help get us

through various traffic jams. Seemingly everything imaginable was for sale along those roads, from prepared foods being sold from small carts; to cages of chickens; to shoes, scarves, or other articles of clothing; to fruits, vegetables or flowers; to dried manure pies; besides for the regular stores and shops. There was always something different to see.

The final evening the India IFYEs hosted a wonderful good bye party. Gifts were exchanged and there was lively dancing to Indian pop music. I greatly enjoy IFYE events. The combination of multiple nationalities, learning new cultures, and making new friends is always the IFYE best!
