Wednesday June 15<sup>th</sup> is the day that my childhood dream became true: To Be an IFYE. Beginning the big oversea adventure meant a night without sleep because of being so nervous and getting up early in the morning to drive to the airport.

We had 6 of them attend the conference –what fun to reminisce. The conference was excellent with more training for coordinators and meeting more of the IFYE's who winter in Florida. Washington D.C from 17th
to19th June, seven (7)
Americans traveling
outbound and eighteen (18)
incoming IFYEs from
different countries came

together. It was an excellent event to meet new friends and IFYE members from all over the world and to know people how are getting a similar experience. After a full weekend of activités, informations, présentations and a tour of Washington D.C everybody was ready to begin their adventure.

June 20th I landed in Orlando where my first host mother Georgene Bender, Florida IFYE Coordinator, met me at the airport. That night I saw the strawberry-moon which was very pretty. I stayed three weeks with Georgene's family, they introduced me to the American culture and lifestyle. I soon got my first cowboy boots and we went line dancing as there was no more excuse not to try it. I learned about Florida's agriculture business, the citrus, blueberry and strawberry farms. Unfortunately I miss the harvest season so we went visiting a plant nursery as well as the famous Parkesdale farm where I tasted the legendary strawberry shake. This was absolutely delicious and I became Luxembourg's Strawberry Queen. I got some informations about the Florida wildlife, alligators, snakes and mosquitos. Adapting to the heat and humidity was a little bit difficult at the beginning because the Luxembourgish weather is very different from Florida's. On the cultural level, I experienced 4th of July and I learned more about Tampa's history by visiting the historic museum, Tampa theater as well as Ybor City. We went for a walk at Bok Tower Gardens and on the beach of St. Petersburg where I could see a beautiful sunset.

I participated as a visitor the 4H Camp Timpochee in Niceville where I learned more about 4H activities for young children, I took an air-rifle and marine science class and went kayaking in the bay. After giving a presentation about my country, the kids' curiosity was awakened and they asked tons of questions.

After five days full of activities and joy at the camp, I had to travel to my second host family. They had a lovely old farm, I took an English-riding class and I learned to rope. My host-sisters were adorable and we had a wonderful time together. I

found out more about home schooling and the army service by the host parents. The able to see wild dolphins and manatees. That was awesome  $\odot$ .

I stayed five days at the 4-H University Camp in Gainesville. An excellent event to find out more about 4-H activities for young adults and career opportunities. In addition I met the Korean and Japanese 4H exchange agents. After giving presentations about our countries at an international workshop we visited the historical museum and the butterfly garden of Gainesville which are very interesting. Having dinner in the Gator stadium was fabulous.

Time to go to my third host family in Panama City where I stayed for three weeks. We went on a turtle-watch walk in the morning and collected shells and sand-dollars. Furthermore, I was able to observe a cheerleader training of my host-sister which was very interesting to see. We visited Panama City beach and down town and I was surprised by the architecture- upside down house (Wonderworks), the big ship of 'believe it or not' and the extraordinary golf court. © This family really wanted to test my car drive abilities and took me with them on their vacations in Kentucky, which means a very long car drive. I did surprisingly very well during the drive and I was just looking out of the window and taking pictures all the way up to Kentucky. It was amazing to see the changes in the landscape by going through the different states. We travelled through north Florida (pine trees), Alabama (cotton fields), Georgia (delicious peaches), Tennessee (smoky mountains) up to Kentucky. We crossed a bridge between Kentucky and West Virginia which connects two states, two cities and two rivers. We went visiting a

glass blow fabric (Blenko) in West Virginia and traveled further north to the Scioto county fair in Ohio were I met an old family friend which came as an IFYE to my family 25 years ago. That was such a fabulous and exciting moment to see her again. We had a good time together and I was



introduced to country music by listening to the live concert of Rio Diamond.

On the way back to Florida, the family and I profited to go for sightseeing. So we stopped in Kentucky at the Cumberland Falls Moonbow (unfortunately we were 2 days early), in Tennessee for the Mayfield Dairy and the Lost Sea Adventure. Mid-August I flew from Pensacola to West Palm Beach to meet my fourth host family. We visited the city of West Palm Beach, I saw the big villas of the famous and rich people. Furthermore, we went to the beautiful beach and witness a sea turtle rescue center where I got some more information about the marine wildlife of Florida. In addition, we also went to a Manatee observation center but the Manatees were too busy to say hello to us  $\odot$ . I got the fantastic opportunity to bake my homemade key lime pie which was the best I have ever eaten, so delicious a recipe that I definitely take home to remind myself of my amazing time in Florida. At the culinary level, my host mother gave me a lesson in cake decorating and at the cultural level I got to watch a college baseball game together with my host brother.

By the end of August I travelled south to get to Miami for my last host family. I was lucky and got to my second baseball game (Miami Marlins) and to got to visit
