While IFYE has not been a part of 4-H since the early 1990s, 4-H is a special part of our history.

Many of us were 4-H'ers-and stayed at the National 4-H Center to attend conferences. We toured Washington, D. C. and witnessed the U.S. Federal Government in action.

Orientation for most outbound IFYEs was held at the National 4-H Center before departing for our host countries. As new IFYEs, we became acquainted with others who became lifelong friends. A quick look at our membership list reveals several married couples who met as IFYEs and the National 4-H Center played a role in many of those introductions. My husband, Larry, and I met at the National 4-H Center in the summer of 1970 during Citizenship Short Course. Nearly every time we visit Washington, D.C., we visit the 4-H Center.

Earlier this month, the National 4-H Council announced the National 4-H Conference Center is for sale. The organization stated they are selling the Center "in order to continue our mission of expanding opportunity for all of America's youth through increased investment and participation in 4-H positive youth development programs." Also, they stated that, "National 4-H Council will continue to be located in the Washington, D.C. metro area" and continue to hold national events by building public-private partnerships.

It must have been a difficult decision for the National 4-H Council to close and sell this beautiful and memory-filled home of 4-H. I

am saddened by this action but hope the National 4-H Center will have a new owner who will appreciate and honor its history for it is much more than grounds and a building.

Program Update

The 2021 U.S. IFYE program has had a successful application, interview, and selection process with 18 individuals selected for two-, three-, or six-month programs. Six of these individuals submitted applications as part of the IFYE - United Soybean Board Leadership Development grant. These participants were interviewed and selected by IFYE and recently confirmed by the United Soybean Board.

We are continuing to monitor the worldwide concerns for the Covid-19 pandemic. Many of our partner countries have cancelled their IFYE program for 2021. IFYE USA will decide within the next month to continue, reduce, or suspend our program for 2021. We will continue to work with our participating countries to examine all options.

We continue to plan for the future. We are expanding our relationships with universities to offer academic credit for outbound IFYEs, adding additional commodity groups and corporate partners for enhanced leadership and job shadowing opportunities, and searching out more host countries to meet the growing number of IFYE applicants. A committee is also developing strategies to work toward re-engaging with Cooperative Extension to promote the IFYE program.
