#### **Program Update**

Outreach to organizations and universities continue to gain momentum. Recently, National Program Director, Alan Lambert, traveled to Iowa State University to visit with faculty and students.

- New Iowa State University 4-H Director Debbie Nistler is enthusiastic about including IFYE back into the Iowa 4-H program in some manner. (Her son, Beau Nistler, was a 2015 IFYE to Thailand.)
- Iowa IFYE alumnus and Iowa State Professor Emeritus William Edwards joined Alan for conversations with Iowa State faculty on how IFYE can meet graduation requirements (international experiences) for students in the Global Resource Systems (GRS) major.
- Then, Alan presented IFYE to:
  - o a senior level GRS class,
  - o the International Ag Club (30 attendees and advisor),
  - o FarmHouse fraternity (75 attendees and advisor) and
  - o Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity (85 attendees).
- From this campus visit, one IFYE application has already been received and 4 more individuals indicated they will be submitting applications in the coming weeks

Marketing materials being developed by the IFYE Board will enable all IFYE alumni to be adequately prepared to share IFYE to a wide variety of youth and adult groups. This will help to dramatically leverage the efforts by IFYE staff to promote the program.

The IFYE Program Development Committee is developing point-of-contact information for additional universities, commodity groups and industry. Consistent and long-term marketing efforts will begin driving applicants to IFYE.

IFYE Board member Barb Batie, Nebraska to Germany 1980, participated in a meeting with professors and officials at the University of Nebraska regarding the opportunity for students there to receive course credit through participating in the IFYE program. Executive Director Ken Gordon joined by conference call and the positive reaction by the University officials is encouraging.

Executive Director Ken Gordon and IFYE Alum Roger Sherer, Indiana to Poland 1978, participated in the Purdue University Career Fair and received 35 résumés from students who showed interest in becoming IFYEs. Six of those who visited with Roger and Ken will graduate in 2020 and three of the six requested follow-up calls to help them with the application process.

The application process is being streamlined for the 2020 program and that process will be completed this month. An announcement will soon be issued to news media and agriculture associations alerting targeted audience groups that applications are being accepted for our 2020 program.

#### **Executive Director Update (Ken Gordon)**

August and September have flown by with many exciting happenings for IFYE. Those attending the National Conference in Lexington were treated to, what many may consider, the highest level of hospitality a person can experience. If you ask someone from Kentucky, they most likely will shrug it off and say, "that's just how we are." It will surely be a conference that people will remember for many years to come.

The biggest news in years for IFYE was announced at the National Conference when we were able to finalize a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Through the MOU, USDA has once again recognized the IFYE Program. The signing of this MOU is the culmination of a meeting some 10 years ago by IFYE to gain recognition from USDA. The process was renewed after a meeting between Deputy Secretary of Agriculture, Stephen Censky, and IFYE leadership in December 2018. The Deputy Director is an IFYE alumnus who experienced the program in 1985 when he traveled to China. After many revisions, the final version was agreed upon during the conference. On September 6, a formal signing ceremony was held in Washington, D.C. You can read the MOU and about the ceremony on the IFYE website by clicking on the News and Events tab.

As part of the effort to connect IFYE with USDA, I was invited to participate in a review panel for grants that were submitted to the National Institute for Food and Agriculture (NIFA). I, along with the other panel members, received 12 grants to review. Each grant was reviewed by four panel members, and once individual reviews were finished, a three-day panel review was convened to discuss and recommend those grants that were deemed appropriate for funding. This provided me with a deep understanding of the process and the components that result in a successful grant application. I plan to use that knowledge to develop an IFYE panel that will work together and produce a grant application in 2020 for our Association.

Please contact me (kgordon@ifyeusa.org) if you've had previous grant writing experience. I am looking for help in the various grant components such as research, narrative, letters of support, supporting documents such as CVs and résumés and finance. Once I have a team in place, we can begin the grant writing process. It was an honor and quite a learning experience to be a participant on the panel.

I am very excited about IFYE and the opportunities that are ahead for our Association. The alignment with USDA is a strong step toward solidifying the future for IFYE.
