Those interested in pre-conference tickets for Noah The Musical on Wednesday the 9th should note that with tax, ticket costs will be \$53.47 for adults and \$26.24 for children 3-12 years. A one-hour behind-the-scenes Noah tour on Thursday at 1 p.m. will cost \$10.09 per adult and \$5.04 per child. Blocks of tickets have been reserved for the 3:30 and 7:30 shows on the 9th and for the tour on the 10th. As you have seen elsewhere in the newsletter, we are pleased that Erin Huckins, who is from the Chicagoland area and a graduating senior at lowa State University was selected as an IFYE. We're still waiting to find out which country she will travel to.



INBOUND IFYES — We will be working to find host families for two inbound IFYE's in Illinois. I don't know yet their home country, but we need your help. Each IFYE should have a minimum of three and up to four host families. They will arrive mid-June and leave around Labor Day. If you have hosted an IFYE in the past, maybe it is time to do so again. If you know of families who might be interested, please visit with them and then please send me their contact information. We had such wonderful, warm and welcoming families last year and Helena from Germany and Bow from Thailand had a great time in the land of Lincoln. Remember, the families do not have to have children living at home, although that really does add to their experience. It is helpful for them to have their own room but definitely must have Don't be afraid to ask a family that hasn't been part of 4-H, last year two of our families had not been part of the 4-H family, but were converts by the end of the program. their own bed. Just think back to your days an IFYE and how much your families added to your experience! We will have a welcome picnic mid-June, probably in Bloomington. We'll ask all the host families to come and meet the IFYEs and they'll go home with their first family. We'll also have a farewell picnic.



OUTBOUND IFYE PARTICIPANTS — We-IFYE USA- currently have around 12 IFYEs who have submitted applications and have been accepted into the program but it's not too late to encourage those whom you believe would be great IFYEs. We are working with Schools and Colleges of several universities, mostly in the Midwest to identify candidates interested in global agriculture. We've been able to work with them to arrange for college credit. If they go in the summer, we work with the candidates so they can leave after Spring Semester and return by the mid-August, in time for Fall Semester. We usually try to have them talk to a recently returned IFYE. I think our very own Illinois IFYE, Nick Birsa has already been a reference for several outbound participants around the country.

It's a lot of work, but it has been fun meeting and making new friends – just like when I was an IFYE. If you might like to help, please give me a call or drop an email. 
Annual Dues are Now Due
