Blast from The Past

The following article written by Clarence Ropp (father of IL IFYE Ray Ropp) appeared in the McLean County Farm Bureau News March 1973.

It was twenty or more years ago, a student from India spent the weekend at our home. He was a brilliant student and good thinker. While eating breakfast Sunday morning my brother stopped in to say hello. Knowing our guest's ability to converse in 4 or more languages, we asked him to say something in his native language. He asked, "What shall I talk about?" Knowing of his love for the great Indian leader, Gandhi, I said "Say something about Gandhi." His statement was brief but to us it was so much chatter and we laughed at his closing statement. Upon hearing our laugher, Sham in all seriousness said, "That which we do not understand we think it to be silly," What a true statement this was and a key to universal understanding.

Years later our son Ray was an IFYE to India, living in nine different homes in three different provinces. They shared their food, their homes, their family life, their customs and their understanding with this lad from another land.

Upon leaving the home of one who could not understand or talk our language nor could Ray understand his, tears fell from the eyes of both for though the 10 days of visitations, admiration had been formed through signs and smiles.

We are grateful to the IFYE Exchange Program for making such a trip possible for Ray and the many youth around the world.

We think of our Indian student's statement, "That which we do not understand, we think silly," Understanding is the key that opens the door to world brotherhood. IFYE's are using that key.

Memorandum of Understanding

The IFYE Association of the USA, Inc. is pleased to announce that a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). and IFYE USA was signed in Washington, D.C. on Friday, Sept. 6, at 11 a.m. IFYE USA President and Missouri IFYE (1978 to Germany) Victoria (Vicky) Fehrmann Warren signed the MOU for IFYE USD. USDA Deputy Secretary Steve Censky, also an IFYE! (Minnesota to China 1985) signed the MOU for USDA. Secretary Censky now lives in Chesterfield, Missouri. (When at home from working in Washington, D.C.) We thank Ken Gordon, IFYE USA Executive Director and Secretary Censky for their diligent work to bring this to fruition.

What does this mean? This means that Extension can help recruit IFYE's over 19 years of age. This has not been possible since 1992 when Extension separated from IFYE and did not allow IFYE to even use the 4-H Emblem. This does not mean Financial Support, but it does mean that USDA once again recognizes IFYE as a Program and IFYE USA as an organization with which it can cooperate to enhance cultural understand and prepare today's and tomorrow's young adults to work globally in Agriculture. It DOES NOT allow use of the 4-H Emblem. It means that IFYE can cooperate with Adult Extension Programs.
